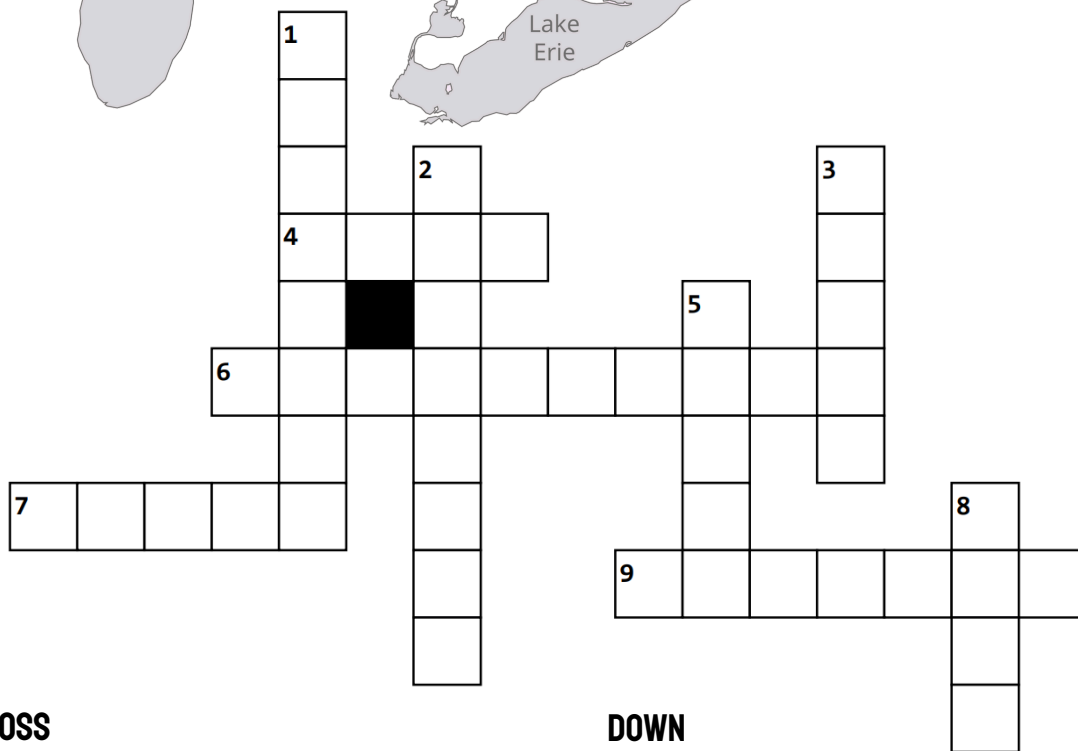


GREAT LAKES CROSSWORD

DOWN

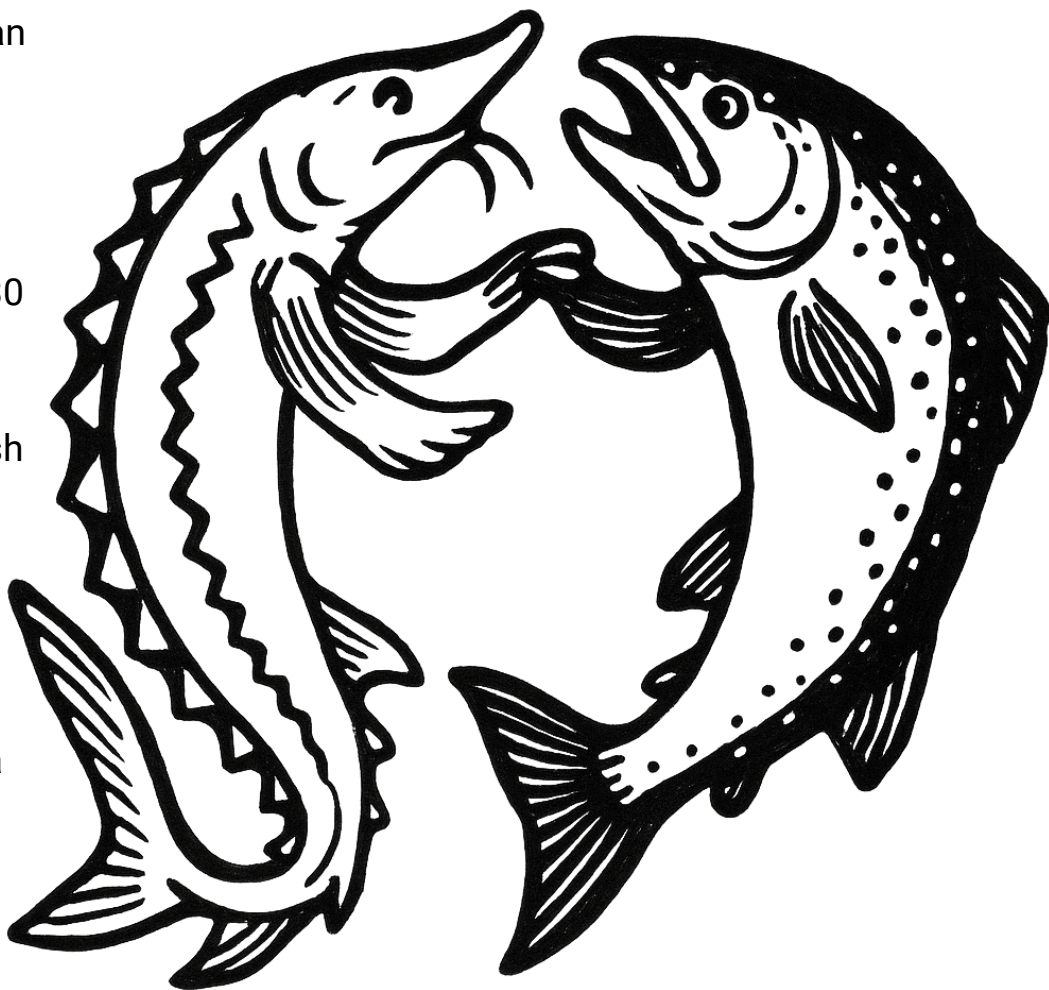
1. This Great Lake is the furthest north and the deepest of the Great Lakes- going up to 1,332 ft deep!

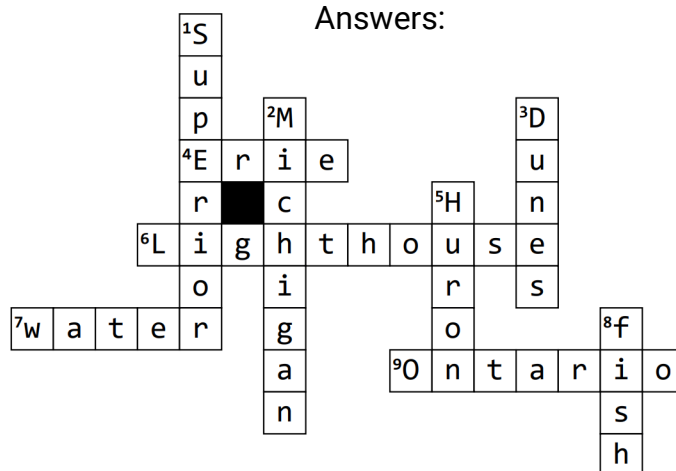
Coho salmon were first introduced to Lake Michigan in the 1960s to help control an overpopulation of tiny fish called alewives — and it worked! Now, they're one of the most popular fish for anglers and can grow up to 30 inches long.

Lake sturgeon are ancient fish that have lived in the Great Lakes for over 150 million years — even before the dinosaurs went extinct! They can live for more than 100 years and grow longer than a grown-up person.
