




# AUGUST LEARNING CHALLENGE

## US LST-393

The USS LST-393 is often called “the ship with three lives.” Built in 1942 as part of the U.S. Navy’s fleet during World War II, LST-393 was designed to transport soldiers, tanks, vehicles, and supplies directly onto enemy shores. She participated in the invasion of Normandy on D-Day and made more than 30 trips across the English Channel, helping deliver critical equipment to Allied forces in Europe. After the war, the ship was decommissioned and eventually converted into a commercial car ferry. Renamed Highway 16, she transported automobiles across Lake Michigan between Muskegon, Michigan, and Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Today, she has found her third life as the USS LST 393 Veterans Museum in Muskegon, where visitors can walk her decks and learn about the service and sacrifice of those who served during World War II.
