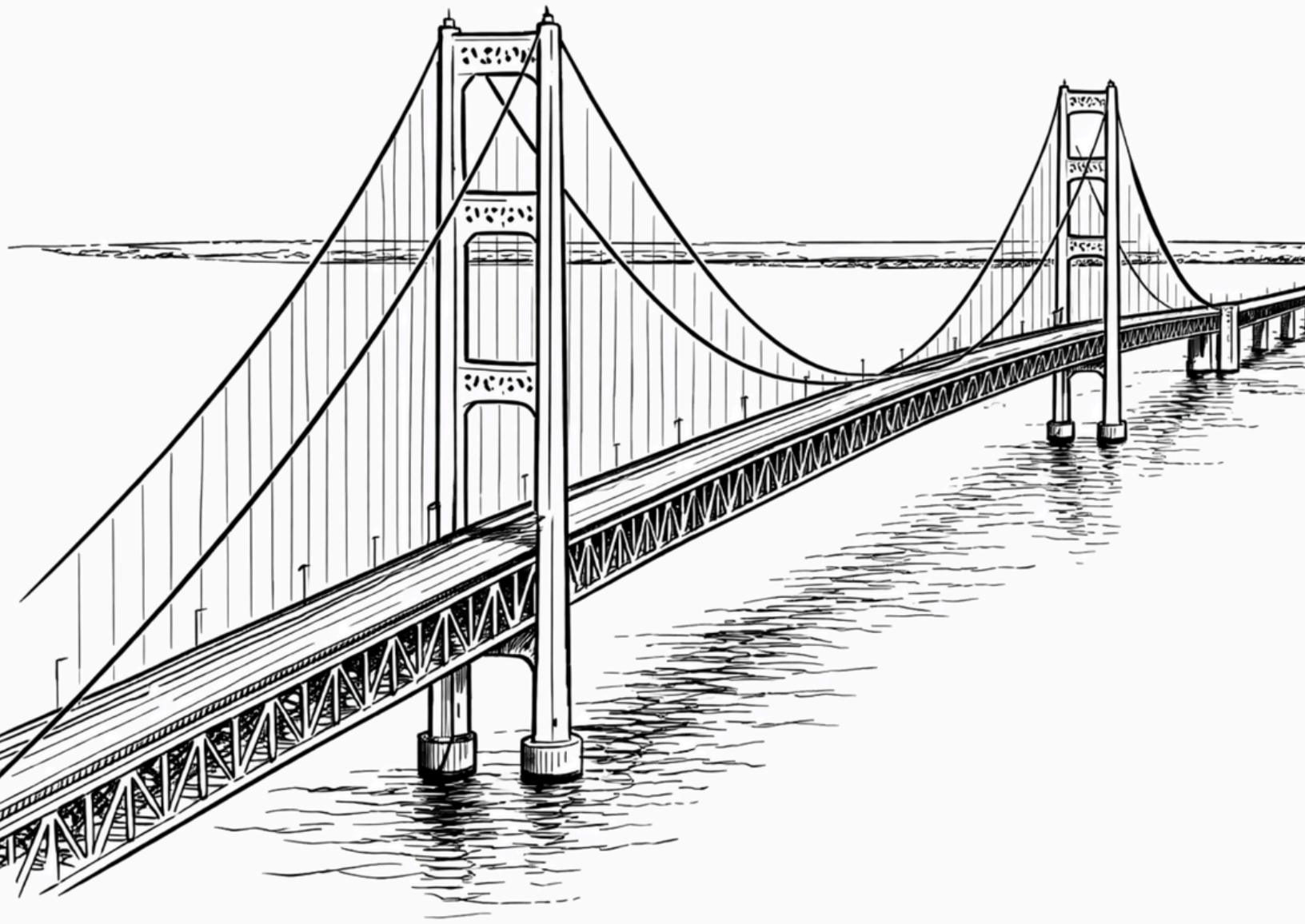




# NOVEMBER LEARNING CHALLENGE

## MACKINAC BRIDGE

On November 1, 1957, the Mackinac Bridge, known as the “Mighty Mac”, officially opened to the public. For the first time in history, Michigan’s Upper and Lower Peninsulas were permanently connected by roadway across the Straits of Mackinac. The dream of spanning the strait dated back to the 1880s, but it was not until the 1950s that construction finally made it possible. When the first cars crossed the five-mile suspension bridge in 1957, a generations-long vision had become reality. Since opening day, more than 100 million vehicles have traveled across the Mighty Mac, making it one of Michigan’s most iconic engineering achievements and forever linking the state’s two peninsulas.
